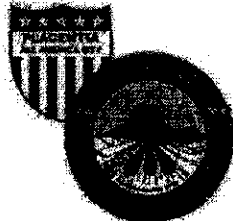

Dear Ladies and Gentleman:


I am writing to request your cooperation and assistance on an issue that involves your respective company. Specifically the daily auctions conducted by your company at the Placentia Civic Center are affecting both the Placentia Library District's operations as well as the City's general and Police Department operations. The use of the Civic Center parking lot by individuals attending your auctions is greatly impacting the availability of parking for patrons of the Library and City Hall. In addition, we are seeing an increase in litter in and around the Civic Center Plaza following each auctions. While I understand your desire to hold your auctions at a centrally located public site, your company's use of the Civic Center has become problematic and I must therefore request that you cease to hold your auctions here.

As an accommodation I am willing to allow you to relocate your daily auctions to Kraemer Park located at 201 N. Bradford Avenue, Placentia, California 92870. The park is not generally utilized during the time frame of your auctions. For public noticing purposes I would suggest that the site be identified as: "IN THE FRONT COURTYARD AT THE MAIN ENTRY AREA TO KRAEMER MEMORIAL PARK, 201 N. BRADFORD AVENUE."

It is understood that properties already under process will continue to be held at the Placentia Civic Center. It is recommended that you work together in the remaining time period to minimize the impact that your auctions on the Civic Center.
